







# ASIAN JUNIOR (OPEN&GIRLS) CHESS CHAMPIONSHIP 2019 Solo, Indonesia 30<sup>th</sup> June to 09<sup>th</sup> July 2019

# **REGULATIONS**

#### 1. Invitation

On behalf of the Asian Chess Federation and FIDE, the Indonesian Chess Federation (PERCASI) has the honor of inviting all Asian National Chess Federations affiliated to FIDE to participate in the Asian Junior (Open & Girls) Chess Championship 2019, to be held in the central Java with exotic Javanese cultural center: Solo, Indonesia from 30<sup>th</sup> June (arrival) to 09<sup>th</sup> July (departure) 2019.

## 2. Participation

- 2.1 Invited Players Each National Federation can enter 1 (one) player each in Open and Girls Categories, total maximum of 2 (two) invited players.
- 2.2 The players placed 1-3 in the Asian Junior Open & Girls Championship 2018 and the Asian Youth Open and Girls Under-18 Champions of 2018 will have personal right and will be accepted as official players if they fulfil the condition of Article 2.4.
- 2.3 Additional Players Additional (extra) players can also be registered in each category by each National Federations.
- 2.4 The players should be below the age of 20 years (born on 1<sup>st</sup> January 1999 and after) and from the Federation in Zone 3.1 to 3.7.

#### 4. Registration

- 4.1 National Federations should register their intentions to participate stating the expected number of participants at least 2 months (01<sup>st</sup> May 2019). This is a Preliminary Registration in order to ascertain number of hotel rooms required. At least 1 month (01<sup>st</sup> June 2019) National Federations should submit their Final Registration of participants. This date 01<sup>st</sup> June 2019 is the registration deadline. Late registration not accepted.
- 4.2 The complete registration form must include the surname, first name, FIDE ID number, FIDE rating and title, and passport details of each player and each accompanying person. It must also include the name, telephone and e-mail of the Delegation Chief and of the Federation Official in charged.
- 4.3 A digital scan of the passport and ID photo of each player and each accompanying person must be sent by e-mail to the Organizing Committee at the address: pb.percasi@gmail.com
- 4.4 All travel expenses must be paid by the participants or their National Federation.
- 4.5 Invited player and his/her official have to pay to the organizer the amount of \$100 for the registration fee.
- 4.6 Additional player and accompanying person have to pay the registration fee in the amount of \$50 for the registration fee.
- 4.7 Registration fee is covering the accreditation, bus transport from Adi Sumarmo International Airport to the official hotel and back to the airport.

## 5. Entry Fees

- 5.1 In accordance with FIDE and Asian Chess Federation regulations, an entry fee of \$75 is required for each invited player. Their National Federation must pay this amount to the Organizing Committee no later than 01<sup>st</sup> June 2019.
- 5.2 For each additional (extra) player, an entry fee of \$150 is required. Their National Federation must also pay this amount to the Organizing Committee no later than 1<sup>st</sup> June 2019.

#### 6. Playing Conditions

- 6.1 Standard Chess category shall be conducted in the Swiss System of 9 rounds, using the Swiss Manager Program. Rapid and Blitz Chess 7 rounds.
- 6.2 The time control:
  - 6.2.1 Standard Chess: 90 minutes with an increment of 30 seconds per move
  - 6.2.2 Rapid Chess: 15 minutes with an increment of 10 seconds per move
  - 6.2.3 Blitz Chess: 3 minutes with an increment of 2 seconds per move
- 6.3 In the last round, where possible, players from the same federation and who have more than 50% score shall not be paired to play each other.
- 6.4 Tie Breaks The final ranking order of the players shall be determined by the number of points scored. If at the end of the tournament, two or more players are tied for the first place or for any prize, the tie shall be broken according to the following tie breaks in the order below:
  - a) Direct Encounter
  - b) Greater Number of Wins (forfeits counted)
  - c) Buchholz Cut 1, Cut 2, etc.
  - d) Sonneborn-Berger

### 7. Technical Delegate, Chief Arbiter and Appeals

- 7.1 The Asian Chess Federation President after consultation with the organizing federation will nominate the Technical Delegate, Chief Arbiter, as well as the necessary assistant arbiters and other officials.
- 7.2 The Chairman of the Appeals Committee shall be nominated by the Asian Chess Federation President in consultation with the organizing federation. The Committee shall be composed of three members and two reserves, all from different Federations, chosen from among the representatives of national federations present.
- 7.3 No member of the committee shall have the right to decide on questions concerning his own federation. In such cases the member concerned shall have the right only to partake in the

discussions of the committee.

- 7.4 Protests, including protests against decisions of the Chief Arbiter or his assistants, must be submitted in writing to the Chairman of the Appeals Committee within fifteen minutes after completion of the relevant playing session. A protest shall be submitted with an accompanying fee of \$100. If the protest is upheld, the protest fee will be returned otherwise it shall be forfeited to the organizing federation. No protests will be entertained for Rapid and Blitz.
- 7.5 In case the above does not produce a decision, the players remaining tied will be proclaimed joint winners of the Asian Junior Champion.

#### 8. Prizes

- 8.1 Trophies and certificates will be awarded to the top 3 players in each category.
- 8.2 Direct titles shall be awarded for Standard Chess. The gold medalist shall receive a Grandmaster norm. Equal first (best 3 players after tie break) shall receive the title of International Master, silver and bronze medalists receive International master norms (or corresponding women's titles) and FM titles in accordance with FIDE title regulations.
- 8.3 For a direct title to be awarded immediately an applicant has to have achieved at some time or other a minimum rating as follows:

IM 2200 WIM 2000 FM 2100 WFM 1900

#### 9. Hotel Accommodation

- 9.1 All players and accompanying persons should be registered through the organizers at the designated official hotel.
- 9.2 Free board will be provided to the invited players as well as to one official per federation from noon of 30<sup>th</sup> July (lunch) to 10<sup>th</sup> July (breakfast) 2019. All invited players are accommodated in double rooms only. Anyone needing single rooms should bear the difference.
- 9.3 All participants and all accompanying persons are obliged to lodge at official hotel.
- 9.4 Cost for full board and lodging (with breakfast, lunch & dinner) for additional (extra) players and accompanying persons are as follows:
